



SWINE

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1. See LIVESTOCK GENERAL RULES for additional requirements.
2. Minimum market hog weight is 225 lbs. Hogs over 300 lbs. will be sold as 300 lbs.
3. Youth exhibitors must have completed the 3rd grade in order to enter a hog.
4. All swine must be on the grounds by 7:00 pm, Wednesday of the week of the fair. Market swine will be weighed-in as they are unloaded. At this point, the youth exhibitor may decide to enter the animal or remove the hog from the grounds. In addition, the youth exhibitor must decide at that time which animal will be designated their market sale animal if they weigh in more than one hog.
5. Each exhibitor must give personal hands-on care and supervision for at least 90 days prior to the fair for each hog they bring.
6. Any youth entering a livestock animal at the Fair **MUST** enter and participate in the appropriate showmanship contest. Youth must show their own animal.
7. A youth exhibitor may not enter more than two hogs in one class.
8. A youth exhibitor may not enter a hog in more than one confirmation class.
9. Market swine are not allowed to compete in breeding classes.
10. All Divisions will be closed 3 minutes after the last gate call.
11. Stalls will be assigned. A youth exhibitor must seek permission from a Swine Barn Superintendent prior to moving or exchanging stalls. If a youth exhibitor moves or exchanges stalls without permission of the Swine Barn Superintendent, the youth exhibitor may risk the loss of his or her premiums.
12. Barn rules will be posted and all youth exhibitors must follow posted rules.
13. If the youth exhibitor and their animal are not in the show ring one minute after all other exhibitors have entered the ring, the gate will be closed, the class will be called and the animal will be disqualified from that division.
14. Parents and leaders are NOT ALLOWED to water, feed, groom or maintain pen cleanliness of a youth exhibitor's hog entered in the fair.
15. Non-market swine will be charged a \$5.00 barn fee, if the animal is sold out of the barn and is not taken home by the youth exhibitor.
16. No animals, other than swine, will be allowed in the swine barn. This includes, but is not limited to, dogs of any breed.
17. There will be a meeting of all Swine exhibitors at 8 pm, Wednesday of Fair Week. There will be a meeting of all Livestock exhibitors at 9:30 am, Thursday of Fair Week and all livestock exhibitors must attend. The Livestock Judging Contest will be immediately after this meeting.
