FLEECE

- 1. Fleece must have been shorn this year and must not be more than one year's growth, except yearling fleeces.
- 2. All wool fleeces must be properly skirted (all face, belly, leg and tag wool removed).
- 3. Fleeces must be rolled flesh side out and displayed in a clear plastic bag. Fleeces will be unrolled for judging.
- 4. Two fleeces may be entered in each class (i.e. 1a, 1b, 1c, etc.).
- 5. Lamb fleece sheared from animal not more than one year old.
- 6. Fleece entered in classes 4 & 7 should be in a plastic container.
