WOODWORKING

1. Items must have been completed since last fair and made by individual whose name is on the exhibitor's tag. If youth, age of youth must also be noted on exhibitor's tag. Exhibitors may make only one (1) entry in any one class - except as described below. Exhibitors are NOT limited only to entries as described in each division, but instead are encouraged to enter additional exhibits in their proper division under class listed "Other." More than one entry will be permitted in "Other" class as long as each entry is a different project and entered as a subclass. For example:
