Department A

General Information and Rules

Animal and livestock entries should be mailed to Joyce Montgomery, by July 15.

Any youth entering a livestock animal at the Fair **MUST** enter and participate in the appropriate showmanship contest.

All Youth animal entry forms **must** be signed by the member's leader or advisor.

Attention Poultry Exhibitors!

All poultry exhibitors **must** comply with WSDA's Rules for Exotic Newcastle Disease (END) and Pullorum/Typhoid Disease. For information concerning END visit the Pend Oreille Country Fair website (<http://www.pocfair.com>) or contact the Poultry Superintendent.

1. Animals must be vet inspected before unloading 3:00 to 7:00pm Wednesday. Poultry, rabbits, cavy, pocket pets and chinchillas will be re-inspected after closing on Wednesday. Animals disqualified at that time **must be removed by the exhibitor**.
2. The superintendents reserve the right to reject any entries showing signs of disease.
3. The exhibitor must own or care for the animals exhibited for the life of the animal or at least 60 days prior to the fair.
4. Youth exhibitors **MUST** care for own animals while at the fair. Adult exhibitors must care for or designate someone in his/her stead. Animals must be cared for and cages cleaned before 9:00am daily for the duration of the fair.
5. Exhibitors **must** attend the meeting Thursday at 7:00am. Exhibitors must wear a "Poultry & Small Animal Barn exhibitor" ribbon and are encouraged to handle their animals during the fair.
6. Exhibitors **are responsible for cleaning their areas** at the end of the fair. Premiums will be held back if this is not done.
7. All exhibits must have breed on entry tags and slips.
8. Market animals will be chosen from blue ribbon winners of the appropriate class and will be sold at the Market Animal Auction on Saturday.
9. All pairs **MUST** be of the same breed unless otherwise noted in the Division and Class section.
10. Primary 4-H exhibitors may show animals in Department A and will receive a green 4-H participation ribbon.
11. Exhibitors must be present for judging of animal or designate someone in their place (to bring the animal to the judging table). Notify superintendents if this is not possible.
12. Youth exhibitors must wear white long-sleeved shirts and dark pants to show animals.
13. The Fair Board will award Grand Champion Non-Market animals in each department 50 extra premium points.
14. Champion poultry, rabbit, cavy and pocket pet exhibits must be in Parade of Champions.
15. Fitting and Showing (youth only) listed in Department Q.
16. Exhibitors will practice Herdsmanship barn duties throughout the day.
17. Educational displays should be three-dimensional incorporating educational poster and other items (natural, fabricated or crafted) pertaining to the project. Display should be no larger than 30" X 30".

All poultry exhibitors **must** comply with WSDA's Rules for Exotic Newcastle Disease (END) and Pullorum/Typhoid Disease. For information concerning END visit the Pend Oreille County Fair website (www.povn.com/pocofair/) or contact the Poultry Superintendent.

Poultry & Game Bird Rules

1. No poultry exhibit under 8 weeks old unless in the fryer classes. These birds are classified by weight.
2. All birds **MUST** be clean.
3. A "pen" is three birds of the same sex and age. Birds must be of same breed.
4. Market poultry can be different sexes.
5. Up to three individual champion market poultry pens will be permitted to sell at the livestock auction. The judge will choose these pens.
6. Birds shown in a trio pen cannot be shown as singles.
7. Ratite exhibitors might need to bring own pens and shelter. Contact superintendents for information.
8. Peafowl are included in the Pheasant division.
9. Any edible egg is permitted in the Egg division.
10. **All youth must participate in Fitting and Showing listed in Department Q.**

Rabbit Rules

1. All rabbits except market rabbits must be at least 10 weeks old.
2. Kits with doe must be at least 8 weeks old or one pound.
3. No bred does due to kindle.
4. Pen of three rabbits must be weaned and from the same litter.
5. Pen of market rabbits may be of different sexes and litters, and 8 to 12 weeks old.
6. Up to three individual champion market rabbit pens will be allowed to sell at the livestock auction. The judge will choose these pens.
7. No rabbits with sniffles, ear cankers or ringworm will be admitted to the show.
8. **All youth must participate in Fitting and Showing listed in Department Q.**
9. All general Fair Rules and Small Animal Barn Rules apply to ALL exhibitors.

POCKET PET RULES

1. All pocket pet exhibitors are responsible for equipment and feed for the animals' healthy and safe upkeep while at the fair (cages, heat rocks, etc.). Chinchilla exhibitors are responsible for supplying dust and dust bath containers.
2. No predatory mammals (ferrets, weasels, etc.) or snakes may be entered as pocket pets.
3. No lizards over 12 inches may be entered.
4. All cavies must be at least 8 weeks old.
5. No pregnant sows or sows with litters.
6. **All youth must participate in Fitting and Showing listed in Department Q**

DRESS CODE:
