1. Items must have been completed since last fair using fabric, thread or yarn. Glued items should be entered in crafts.
2. Check to see that garments you are entering are **clean, pressed, threads clipped**, etc. Be careful of pet hair! Any items in any division showing obvious wear will NOT be accepted.
3. Points allowed are listed for each division.
4. **Exhibitors may make only one entry in each class. No duplicate items.** The “other” classes are only to be used for items not listed.
5. Fairs are about education so **we want your stories**. Why did you choose the material you used? How did you come up with the design? Did anything happen during the construction that posed a problem? How did you solve it? **Stories are required for Oops! Disaster Struck, My Buddy and Me and Repurposed.**
6. People do ask for patterns, directions and type of yarn used. We invite you to include a yarn wrapper and/or your pattern source if you choose to share.
7. There are three cross-department awards. Eligibility for the Beth O’Neill Murphy Award: a blue ribbon in knitting in both Clothing and Needle Arts. Eligibility for a Homemaker’s Award: a blue ribbon in Clothing, Needle Arts, Baking and Food Preservation.

RULES

1. There is no limit on age of entrant.
2. Men and women entrants are welcome.
3. Garments must be shown on the seamstress or tailor or on an appropriate model (garments do not have to be modeled by the person who made them).
4. Categories include children's clothing; men's wear, women's wear; teen wear.
5. Grange participants should follow Grange Contest rules.
6. Only home sewn garments will be accepted.
7. Garments must have been made between September and August of the current fair year.
8. Registration deadline for entries is July 31.
